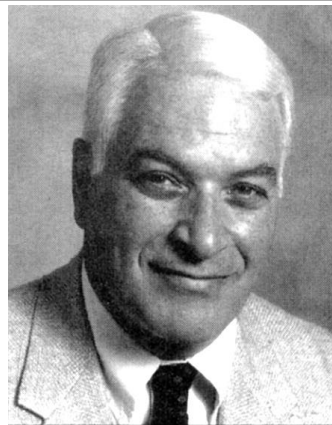

Dr. Turner Named Surgical Chair at University of Mississippi

William W. Turner, Jr., MD, FACS has been named James D. Hardy Professor of Surgery and chair, department of surgery, The University of Mississippi Medical Center. He is to assume that position November 30, 1998. Dr. Turner has been chief of the department of surgery at Methodist Hospital since 1992, and presently is co-chief of surgery at Clarian Health Systems. He has been active in the Indiana Chapter serving as program chair for two years, as president-elect and as president in 1996-97. Since 1997 he has served on the Board of Governors of the College as Governor at Large from Indiana. Dr. Turner was professor of surgery at the University of Texas, Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas prior to coming to Indiana.



Dr. Grosfeld Elected Honorary Fellow

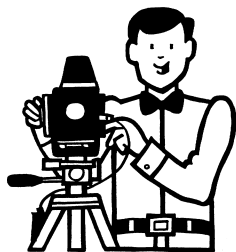

Dr. Grosfeld also was awarded the **Denis Browne Gold Medal** for outstanding contributions to the field of pediatric surgery by the **British Association of Pediatric Surgeons** at a recent meeting in Bristol, UK.

Dr. Wells to Give Moore Lecture

Samuel A. Wells, Jr. MD, FACS, Director of the American College of Surgeons will give the twelfth Will C. Moore lecture on Friday November 20, at the Adams Mark Hotel. Dr. Wells is a native of Georgia and graduated from Emory University and the Emory University School of Medicine. His internship and a year of internal medicine were at Johns Hopkins Hospital. He became an assistant resident at Barnes Hospital, completing his surgical training at Duke University Medical Center. Prior to becoming Director in March 1998, Dr. Wells was Bixby Professor of Surgery and chair of the department of surgery at Washington University, St. Louis, MO.

This year there are three outstanding guest speakers:

Scott Frame, MD FACS, Director of Trauma & Surgical Critical Care at the University of Cincinnati in Cincinnati, Ohio will present "Iatrogenic Hypothermia in the Trauma Patient: Prevention, Diagnosis and Management."

Michael D. Pasquale, MD FACS, Director of Trauma & Surgical Critical Care at Lehigh Valley Hospital in Allentown, Pennsylvania, and presently Chairman of the Practice Guidelines Committee of the Eastern Association for the Surgery of Trauma, will present "Evidence-Based Medicine and Practice Guidelines from Development to the Bedside in Trauma and Critical Care."

Arthur L. Kellerman, MD MPH, Director of the Center for Injury Control at the Rollins School of Public Health, and Professor of Emergency Medicine at Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia, will address the issue of "Youth Firearms and Violence."
